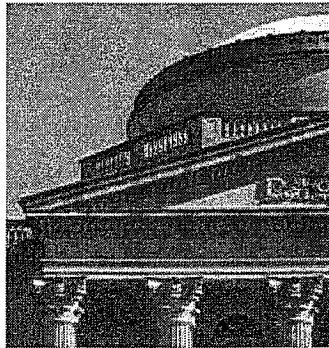

SPECIAL PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS

Below is a listing of the many programs sponsored by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions for select students. Please note that these events are invitation-only.

Academic Days

These are special half-day events offered each fall designed to introduce selected high school seniors to the stimulating and collaborative academic atmosphere at Carolina. As part of these events, students are invited to participate in special discussion groups in specific academic areas of interest. Previous events have focused on journalism, nursing, and business. Camp Carolina

This event is an all-expense paid (meals, housing, and materials), two-night program at UNC-Chapel Hill specifically for rising eighth and ninth graders across North Carolina. Carolina Close-Up

Carolina Close-Up is a program for top North Carolina high school seniors. A special invitation is extended to high-achieving minority students who have been accepted to Carolina to clarify any remaining concerns or questions about the University. As a participant in Decision Days, students have an opportunity to hear from selected faculty, staff and students about the academic programs, financial aid, housing and social life here at Carolina. In addition, they will have an opportunity to attend an academic class. This program is highly recommended for students seriously considering UNC-Chapel Hill and have not visited the campus or participated in one of our earlier
