



Where to Apply

Reach: Admission is "iffy" or have admit rates between 7-20% (dream school)

Possible: Closely meet school profile expectations; competition for space could be tight

Probably: Chances for admissions are strong

Financial Safety: School you can afford if your aid package is not strong at other schools

Application Types

Early Decision

Students Apply to only one (1st choice) institution

If admitted, you enroll- Binding!

- Deadlines &NotificationsOccur Early
- Early Decision

Early Action

Students Apply & Receive Notifications Early

No limit to the number of institution you can apply to

- Changes to UNC's Early Application Policy
- Non-binding

Rolling

Application is processed and reviewed as it is complete

No limit to number of applications

 Decisions may come within a matter of days or weeks


Restrictive Early Action

Apply to preferred institution early and may be prohibited from applying ED or EA elsewhere

 Decisions are non-binding

Regular Decision

Submit application by a specific deadline and receive notification by published date








CSS Profile

- CSS PROFILE: Some colleges require this form in addition to the FAFSA (UNC-CH, Davidson, Duke, Elon, High Point, Wake Forest)
 - Used to distribute institutional aid
 - Costs money to file (\$25 for 1st school; \$16 for each additional school)
 - www.collegeboard.com
 - Early Decision/Early Action should file between November and February

Things to Consider

- All colleges accept students on a conditional basis & senior grades will be a final aspect of evaluation.
- Admissions can be rescinded
- Q1 & Q2 grades are important for admissions
- Midyear grades only sent by school request
- Schedule specific times to work on applications
- Don't panic if you get a mass reminder/email from a college
- Manage your stress and work on one thing at a time.
- Attention to detail matters in this process. Establish a system to stay organized.
